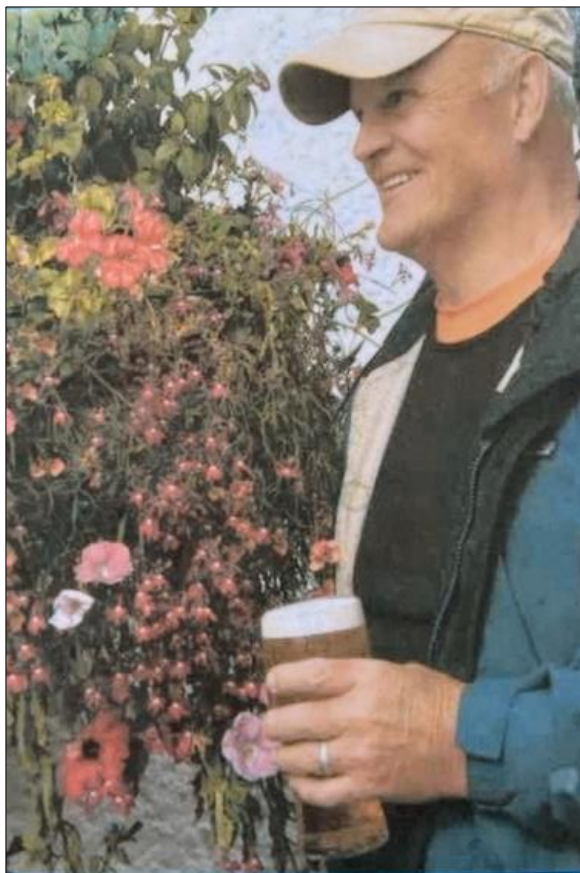

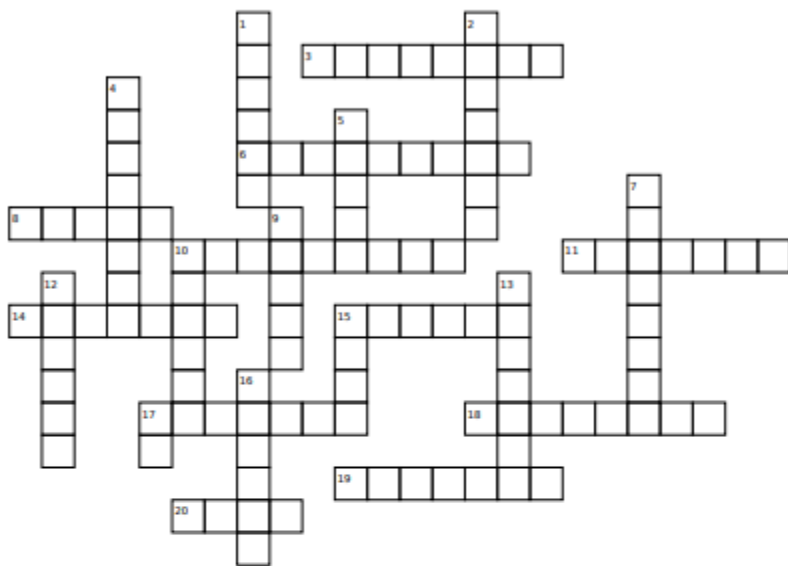

Fluffy Omelet (from 1947 Cooking class at Coolidge School in Melrose)

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees.

Heat a stick proof frying pan on medium. Lately, I've got to putting in a dab of salad oil and adding a small onion, chopped, as well as some green pepper. Some herbs from Provence add some sizzle.

Get out two bowls and separate the eggs: yolks in one, whites the other.

The full recipe calls for 3 eggs, 3 T of flour, 1 tsp. baking powder, pinch of salt and pepper, and $\frac{3}{4}$ cup of milk. Now days, I use skimmed milk and two eggs.

So for every egg you use, use 1 T flour, $\frac{1}{3}$ tsp. baking powder, $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of milk etc.

Add the flour, the baking powder, salt, pepper to the yolks and stir a bit. Add milk, slowly while stirring. Whip the whites with an egg beater 'til they are stiff. When done fold the yolk mixture into the whites. Add mixture to the frying pan. Cook for 10 minutes or so on medium. 'Til the cat's eyes stop. Place in oven for 10 minutes, until the top dries nicely.
