## Proposal and Timeline

- Annual meeting 2023:

Congregations approved continued work by the task force to address the details of uniting the two congregations into one organization.

- Throughout 2023:
- Legal and financial issues are being addressed to create a new organization with the following characteristics:
- 1. Facilities in both Weston and Wellesley under one leadership team
- 2. Worship in both locations with Weston service led by the $2^{\text {nd }}$ year Resident
- 3. Weston parsonage is available as a home for Residents and their partners.
- 4. Members of the worshiping community in Weston will be involved in planning their services and in the vetting and choosing of Residents.
- Interfaith Center for Worship, Learning and Service is preparing to be launched in Weston.
- Special Congregational Meetings in February 2024:
- Congregations will be asked to approve final details of a plan to unite the two congregations
