


ABOUT THE ORGAN

The magnificent Rieger organ at Village Church has been leading congregational singing, accompanying choral anthems, and heard by itself during musical mediations, preludes, and postludes as well as concerts for nearly sixty years. The organ was installed in 1967 and dedicated in 1968.

The instrument is quite large. With 43 stops and 65 ranks over 3 manuals and pedal, this organ allows for many color possibilities. Regarding its tonal philosophy, the instrument most certainly leans toward the neo baroque style of organ building of the organ reform movement. However, the instrument executes the works of the German and French Romantic periods with ease. It also has quite a commanding sound for American music. The instrument overall though lends extremely well to the performance of works from the German and French baroque periods.

The instrument is built with mechanical key action, which responds rapidly and sensitively to touch. Its dynamic range extends from a soft, sweet pianissimo to a thrilling fortissimo and with the removal of the carpet in Village Church, the organ really "sings" into the space. Physically, the organ's layout stretches across the balcony and makes for a simple yet dramatic visual effect in the sanctuary.

The organ went through a major rebuild in the summer of 2011, during which it received a new updated console and refurbished action. This work was designed and carried out by Stefan Maier Tracker Organs of Orange, MA. In 2020, the instrument was named in honor of **David R. Carrier**, who served as director of music and organist at Village Church from 1985 through 2021.



ABOUT THE PERFORMER

Kristjon Imperio performs extensively as a conductor, collaborative musician, and recitalist in the Northeast. While earning his Bachelor of Music, he received formal piano instruction from his father, Roy Imperio, and organ from William Ness. His 'Musical Genealogy' includes pianists/composers Pressler, Busoni, Liszt, Beethoven, and Scarlatti.

Kristjon has performed concerti of Bach, Mozart, Beethoven, Grieg, Rachmaninoff, Tchaikovsky, and Brahms with orchestras throughout the United States. As a conductor, he has led performances of major orchestral and choral works by Vivaldi, Haydn, Mozart, Chopin, Dvorak, Vierne, Duruflé, Vaughan Williams, Hindemith, Barber, and Rutter.

During the day, Kristjon is full-time as director of programs and community engagement at Pakachoag Music School of Greater Worcester. He is on the Executive Committee of the Worcester Chapter of the American Guild of Organists and is president of the Worcester Organ Festival. Kristjon has served as organist and assistant director of music at Village Church since 2021.
